

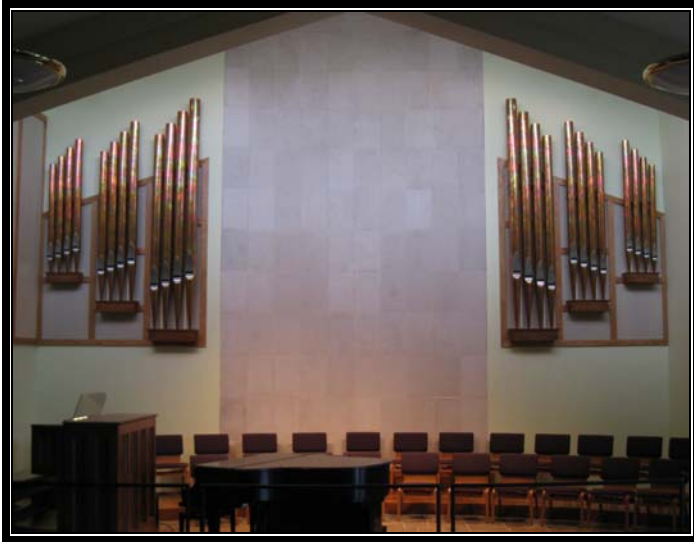

Reuter Opus 595 was built in 1937 as a demonstration organ. It was first displayed in Simonson's Music Store in Chicago. Later, it was set up at Trinity Lutheran Church in downtown Ann Arbor and was eventually purchased by the congregation. In the mid-1960s, after the church moved to its present location on Stadium Drive, the organ was enlarged and installed in balcony chambers. Finally, in 2007, the instrument was removed for comprehensive refurbishing in conjunction with a major remodeling of the sanctuary. It again received additional ranks, new leather as needed, a new console and a complete cleaning and regulation. The instrument has now been relocated in new chambers in the former chancel area.
