The First United Methodist Church in Mount Pleasant originally had a tracker organ in its early history, which was later replaced with an electronic instrument. The chancel area has now been remodeled to accommodate a return to pipes. The classic façade of the new organ, with three bays of pipes supported by oak woodwork, is designed to complement the historic sanctuary. The cleverly conceived specification of this unit organ allows for a concise installation and remarkable versatility.
