First United Methodist Church in Gainesville, Georgia, installed its first organ in 1917. Built by the Austin Organ Company, this 13 rank instrument served the needs of the church until 1980, when it was moved to their current building. A new console was then added and the tonal resources were expanded to 32 ranks by the Reuter Organ Company. In 2005, after the failure of major components of the original Austin installation, Reuter was again contracted to completely upgrade the instrument, including a state of the art console and the addition of nine ranks of pipes for a much more versatile tonal scheme. The console from the 1980 rebuild was taken in on trade and used to upgrade a 1920's Reuter installation at another site.
